
From the President of USFCH

To accomplish this end, the long-range plan calls for building an additional dormitory at the Village site...but first, the school must become a reality.

USFCH Mission Trip

A team of people from Oklahoma, California, Massachusetts, and Canada gathered in Haiti thinking their work would be painting and whatever other tasks might be asked of them. Little did they anticipate the challenge, joy, and accomplishment of making it possible for 28 profoundly challenged children from Hope Home to go to the beach for a day. Transportation in Haiti is never easy; traveling with disabled children, many of whom are paralyzed to a great degree, can only be accomplished with God's grace. But the team, with house moms and therapists, made it happen. Two hours each way on a big yellow school bus with children held on loving laps got the job done.

For each child it was a day of pure bliss. To be held by one person and to have the full attention of an adult for an extended time was a great treat. To relax stiff limbs and float in warm salt water was heaven. So many smiles, so much joy! This was the third time the children had gone to the beach in the last year thanks to planning by Dora Namere, director of Hope Home. It is Dora's dream to one day have a therapy pool at the Village because water is such a healing and therapeutic experience for those with disabilities.

Back at Children's Village of Hope, all of the downstairs bedrooms at Rainbow of Love Nursery received a fresh coat of paint. The house moms who work tirelessly to care for the children were delighted to have freshly painted and decorated rooms for themselves and their children.

Alanda, pictured with her therapist and a blind baby boy named Renald, had surgery a year ago and is showing great improvement in her ability to walk with support. Prior to surgery she scooted on her knees. Alanda and two other children at Hope Home attend a school for children with special needs. Thanks to generous donations, she is able to receive daily therapy and is becoming more independent and confident every day.

There are lots of new children at Children's Village of Hope. Dana Smith, a volunteer from Trinity Baptist Church, Norman, OK is holding a little girl named Namey.

Many new sponsors were found among those on the recent mission/work team. One sponsor is Moy Williams from Fountain Vally, CA who is now sponsoring Jean Dany.

Caitlin Utely, from Sherman Oaks, CA and Marc Forcier from Abbotsford, Canada are two young adults who were adopted from the Foundation. They returned to Haiti to learn more about their homeland and to discover ways they can give back. Many adult adoptees are returning, and we are hopeful to have a reunion in the future. We are always thrilled to learn that OUR grown "children" appreciate the beginning they received in our care and of their desire to share what they learned and support the children now at Haiti Home, Rainbow of Love Nursery, and Hope Home.

Each trip and every team has unique experiences. Friendships are made, and lives are changed, both for those visiting and those living in Haiti. Please consider joining us on such a trip one day.
